



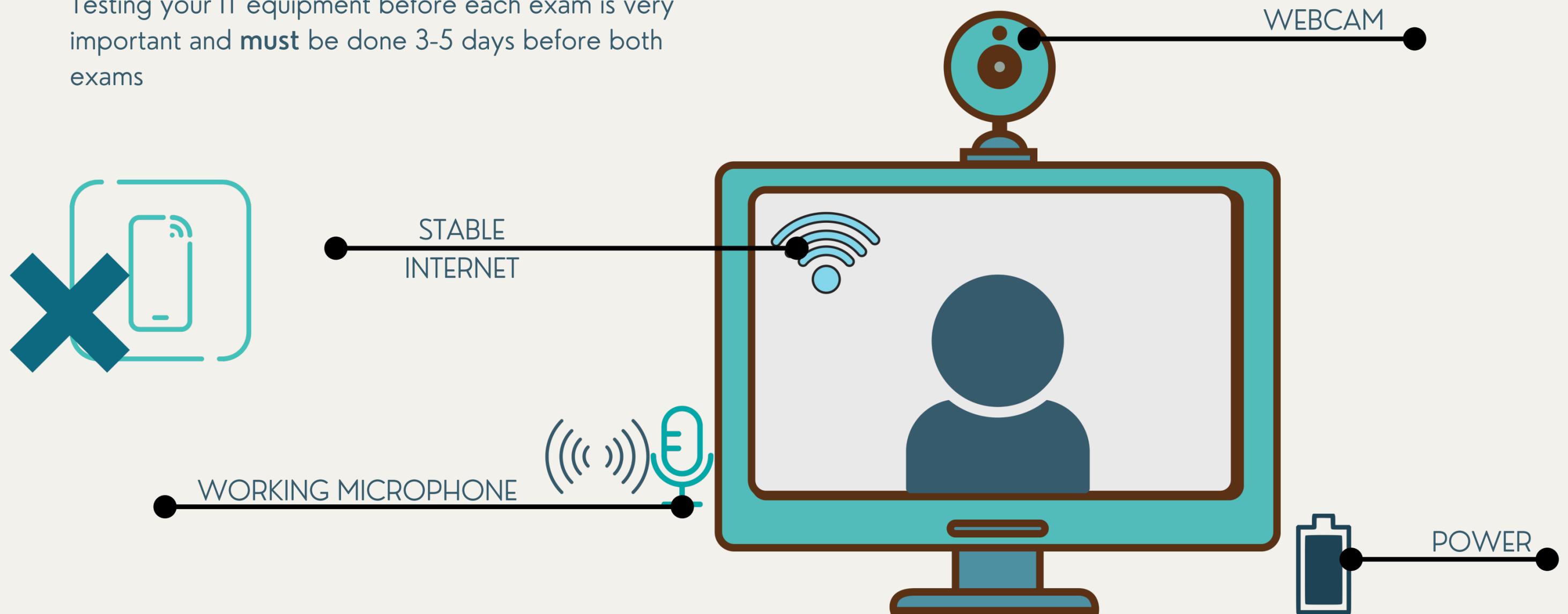

# IT requirements

Testing your IT equipment before each exam is very important and **must** be done 3-5 days before both exams



# Before Testing

Before starting the testing procedure, there are a couple of considerations to be aware of, including what browser is being used, and the location where testing is occurring.

# Step 1: Equipment Check via ProctorU

Test equipment by logging into your ProctorU account via the link in the Auditor Handbook.

This test will indicate if the equipment is functioning properly, or if it has failed in specific categories and requires attention before moving forward with the exam



# Step 2: Connect to a Live Technician

After testing the equipment, connect to a live technician to complete the equipment and connection test

Fill out the web form and click 'equipment check'

Ensure form details are correct & that the name listed matches the name registered with ProctorU, the institution is listed as APSCA **NOT** the audit firm, and the date of the scheduled exam is correct

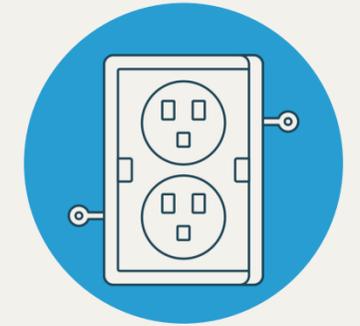

## Stable internet is key

A solid and stable internet connection is vital to exam success. Consider connecting to an ethernet port as opposed to using wireless for a more stable connection

## Plug into a power source

Functioning computer systems are nothing without a fully charged battery. When testing equipment and on exam day, plug devices into a power socket, **do not** rely on a battery
